



Betty Louise Stoneburner

July 11, 1924 - June 20, 2018

Betty Louise (Anderson) Stoneburner, 93, of Cambridge, passed away peacefully, Wednesday, June 20, 2018, at Altercare, Cambridge.

She was born July 11, 1924, at the family home east of Cambridge, daughter of the late Charles E. and Mary Inez (Gibbons) Anderson.

She graduated from Old Washington High School in 1941 as valedictorian of her class.

On May 2, 1942, she married her high school sweetheart, Clarence D. Stoneburner, who passed away May 4, 2010.

The two of them first operated a small family dairy near Buffalo in the 1940's, producing and delivering bottled milk to resident of Buffalo and Pleasant City. They then purchased the family farm near Salesville and operated a dairy farm for many year.

She was employed at Champion Spark Plug Co., Cambridge, where she retired in 1987 after 32 years of service.

After retirement, they spent their winters in Florida, where she was active in the Ladies Golf Association, getting a hole-in-one at the age of 73. They also served in many capacities in the Travelers' Rest Church Association. Volunteering was a part of her life as she volunteered at Dade City Hospital in Florida during the winter for several years and also volunteered at Southeastern Med for over 20 years.

She was a member of the First Christian Church in Cambridge, and Guernsey Chapter # 211, Order of the Eastern Star, where she served a Worthy Matron in 1972 and was also appointed as Grand Representative of Scotland in 1973 where they visited and formed many friendships.

She was proud that she had never missed attending the Guernsey County Fair during her lifetime as her father was a volunteer during her childhood, she and Clarence were 4-H club advisor, and in later years they enjoyed spending a day at the fair visiting with family, friends and former 4-H club members.

She was preceded in death by her siblings, Katherine Tennent Gearhart, Helen Steele, George Anderson, Andrew Anderson and James Anderson, a son-in-law, Joe VanReeth, grandson-in-law Sean Sari, and a step great-grandson, Travis Ridenour.

She leaves many loving memories to be cherished by two daughters, Kay VanReeth, Zanesville, Sandi (Ron) Herman, Cambridge and son, David (Anne) Stoneburner,

Livingston, Texas.
