



Alfred M. Glass

January 13, 1917 - March 15, 2012

Alfred Marion Glass, of Cambridge, born January 13, 1917 to Christina (Nelson) & Frank Glass, in Hillsville, PA. He grew up on a family farm which had belonged to his grandparents in Bessemer, PA.

On Sundays, he and his older brother Bill walked over a mile across railroad tracks to attend Sunday School.

In high school he was an excellent basketball player. He worked on a neighboring farm for a dollar a day until after his grandfather died. The family moved into the family farm and his grandmother lived with them. Al eventually got a factory job and helped the family which by that time had increased to seven children. When he was 22 years old he had a full time job and had a car which helped the family alot.

On Halloween eve 1939 a neighbor girl invited him to a party. At that party he met a young girl friend of the hostess and they all had a good time. A few evenings after the party this friend was sitting quietly at home when a knock came on the door. When she answered, Al was the young man was at the door. They made a date and were married on his birthday, January 13, 1940.

Following his receiving his Education degree in 1949 he moved his family to Mecca, Ohio in order to accept his first teaching job at a salary of \$2500. In 1950 he became principal at Greene School (now Maplewood School District) in Trumbull County. In 1957 he became Superintendant of M&M School District (Malta - McConnelsville) and in 1960 moved to Canton to work for Stark County Board of Education as high school supervisor, and principal at

Canal Fulton School District. In 1972 became Superintendent of the Zane Trace School District; proceeded to become principal at Grand Valley School District in Orwell, retiring in 1979 in order to spend time with his wife and daughter. He spent his leisure traveling and golfing. He was an avid golfer, organizing the golf leagues in this area.

He is survived by: his wife, Mary Elizabeth (Stillwagon) Glass; daughter, Marian Glass of Brookfield; sister, Virginia Burnside of Bessemer, PA; and brother; Harry "Pete" Glass of Bessemer, PA. and many nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by: his parents; a daughter, Sally Jean; two brothers, Willard Glass & Frank Glass; and two sisters, Mildred Hodge & Betty Hancock.

Visitation will be on Sunday, March 18, 2012 at Bundy-Law Funeral Home from 1 to 4 pm. The service will be on Monday, March 19, 2012 at 11 am with Rev. Floyd Costello and Rev.
