Anne M. Balas, age 101 of Kimbolton, passed away on Thursday, August 20, 2015 at Riverside Manor in Newcomerstown. She was born on March 2, 1914, in Taylor, Pennsylvania, a daughter of the late Ignatius Kapala and Christine (Ducak) Kapala.
