Aubrey W. Hinson, age 75, of Cambridge, died Sunday August 10, 2003 at his home. He was born January 3, 1928 in Rosemary, North Carolina, the son of the late Morgan and Annice Atkins Hinson.

He was a retired chief stationary steam engineer for the former Cambridge State

Hospital and retired supervisor of buildings and grounds for Cambridge City Schools.
