



## Brent Lee Umberger

March 29, 1937 - June 9, 2005

Brent Lee Umberger, age 68 of Cambridge, died Thursday, June 9, 2005 at Southeastern Ohio Regional Medical Center in Cambridge. He was a son of the late Bernard Lenear Umberger and late Mercedes Lenore Parker Umberger McKisson.

He founded and established Sportsman's Haven, Inc. in 1962 where besides retailing and repairing long guns, he developed the unique craft of stock making for high grade shotguns and rifles. He enjoyed shooting the clay target sports of trap, skeet and sporting clays. He served as president of the Ohio State Trap Shooting Association. He was also an avid hunter. He was an instrument rated pilot who owned his own plane. He served as president of the North American Comanche Society and as a member of the Cambridge Airport Authority for 13 years. He was a long time elder and member of the Unity Presbyterian Church where he served on numerous committees. In addition to these he enjoyed family, friends, building model airplanes, traveling and collecting model trains. Brent is survived by his wife Nancy Carol Miller Umberger of Cambridge, they were married on June 25, 1960.
