Cecil W. Lawrence, age 88 of Cambridge, passed away on Friday, September 26, 2014 at his home. He was born on September 13, 1926 in Newcomerstown, Ohio, a son of the late Willis Gilbert Lawrence and Mary Beatrice (Love) Lawrence.

Mr. Lawrence was retired from the U.S. Air Force, in 1972. While on active duty he served in W.W.II, the Korean Conflict and in Vietnam.
