



Charles Curtis Warner

February 20, 1929 - April 3, 2017

Charles Curtis Warner, age 88 of Cambridge, passed away on Monday, April 3, 2017 at Southeastern Ohio Regional Medical Center. A son of the late Chester Mordecai Warner and Helen Marie (Gallagher) Warner, he was born in a log cabin in Beaver Township, Noble County on February 20, 1929 with his great grandmother Elizabeth Betts as the midwife.

Charles graduated from the Ohio State University with a degree in agriculture. Soon after graduating, he was drafted into the U. S. Army and served in Korea with the Ninth Corp Artillery Headquarters as a radio operator. After being discharged he began his lifelong dream of farming. He also was a carpenter on the side and worked on many of the bridges on US 70 and worked on the construction of the Salt Fork Dam. In 1965 he began a 30 year career with the Cambridge Post Office as a city letter carrier. Along with his full time job, he lived his dream as a farmer and was actively working his farms till the age of 82.

Charles Curtis was a lifelong member of the Gospel Church of Christ, a member of the former Indian Camp Grange 1424, where he served as master for over 30 years, a member of the former Guernsey County Pomona Grange where he also served as master for many years. He was a member of National Association Letter Carriers serving as president of branch 634 in Cambridge and on the Ohio State Executive Board of NALC, he was an advisor for Green Acres 4-H Club, a member of the Guernsey County Extension Advisory Board, the Guernsey County Farm Bureau, the Guernsey

County Cattleman's Association and president of Liberty School PTA.

Chuck is survived by: his wife Marca Warner, whom he married on December 29, 1994; his children, Randy (& Judy) Warner, Debby (& Jim) Neff, Betsy Warner and Ken (& Kim) Warner; his grandchildren, Aaron (& Denise) Warner, Tyler Warner, Aaron (& Kelsey) Neff, Brian Neff, Christina Neff; Kaylin (& Austin) Warner and Corey (& Kaitlin) Warner; his great grandchildren, Violet, Maxwell, Mason, Keagon, Stella Rose and JP; his sisters, Iona Mae Gregg and Anna Lee (& David) Mizer; a brother-in-law Randy (& Carolyn) Larrick and many nieces, nephews and cousins including Norma Lee Warner and special friends, Brian (& Brenda) Hursey.
