Mr. Brown was born December 17, 1925, in Cambridge, son of the late Raymond S. Brown and the late Cynthia M. Snyder Brown. He was a 1943 graduate of Cambridge High School, a U.S. Navy veteran WW II Solomon Islands, and a 1949 graduate of The Ohio State University, College of Agriculture.

A Presbyterian by faith, Mr. Brown served as Treasurer and on Session and the Board of Trustees for the Second Presbyterian Church, prior to its merger, now Unity Presbyterian Church. He was also a long-time member of the Cambridge Lions Club.

Mr. Brown was a dedicated public servant while he operated his own poultry and beef cattle operations. He worked in the Cambridge Post Office, served as the director of the Division of Aid for Aged, served as a hearing officer and supervisor for the State Department of Welfare and served as the director of Disaster Services and Coordinator of the CEDA program for Guernsey County. The position of service he enjoyed the most however, was his service

as Cambridge Township Clerk where he served for over 18 years. He was also Executive Vice President and Board of Directors member of the former Quaker City National Bank. During his retirement and prior to his illness, he enjoyed his frequent luncheons with his many friends in the cafeteria at Southeastern Ohio Regional Medical Center.

A dedicated family man, father and husband, he is survived by his wife Janet M. Heldman Brown, whom he married September 26, 1947, a son, Attorney Donald D. Terri Brown of Cambridge, and two daughters, Kathy E. Rich Hobbs of Dublin; and Amy L. David Yanka of Goodyear, Arizona; 4 grandchildren, Darren R. Hobbs, Taylor R. Hobbs, Tyler D. Yanka and Madison L. Yanka; 1 niece, 3 nephews and several special cousins.
