Dr. Earl Conaway Sr., 94, died Wednesday, July 27, 2005 at Southeastern Ohio Regional Medical Center, Cambridge.

He was born July 21, 1911 in Cambridge, son of the late Milton Earl and Marie Catherine Kessler Conaway.

He was a 1930 graduate of Cambridge High School. He attended Muskingum College and was a graduate of Case Western Reserve Medical School.

Dr. Conaway served in World War II Air Corp. He was a member of 1st United Presbyterian Church, Cambridge.

Dr. Conaway was a family physician who practiced in Cambridge for over 57 years.
