



## Gene T. Laughman

January 27, 1928 - September 22, 2021

Gene T. Laughman, age 93 of Cambridge, passed away on Wednesday, September 22, 2021 at Wheeling Medical Park. He was born on January 27, 1928 in Senecaville, Ohio, a son of the late Robert R. Laughman and Lana A. (Harding) Laughman.

Mr. Laughman served his country in the U.S. Army during the Korean Conflict. He worked as a heavy equipment operator for many years. Gene was a member of the Guernsey Lodge 66 F & AM, the Scottish Rite Valley of Cambridge, the York Rite, the Eastern Star Chapter #211; the Cambridge Eagles Lodge and the American Legion. Gene had a private pilot's license and at one time, navigated the Budweiser airship "Budone".

Gene is survived by: his wife Shirley Ann (Phillips) Laughman; a sister Margaret "Peggy" Moorehead of Columbus; and several nieces and nephews including Charlie (& Catherine) Laughman.
