



## George III James Bryan

January 1, 1922 - December 25, 2003

George James Bryen III, 81, of Cambridge, died Thursday Dec. 25, 2003 at Victorian Oaks Assisted Living Center in Cambridge.

He was born Jan. 1, 1922, in Washington, Pa., son of the late George James Bryen and Margaret Graeser Bryen Ewing.

Mr. Bryen was a retired teacher, having taught in the East Muskingum Schools. He was a Protestant by faith, and a U.S. Air Force veteran, having served from 1943 to 1946, and achieving the rank of sergeant.

He was Elder and Lay speaker at Giffen Park Church in St. Clairsville.

He was a member of Guernsey County Historical Society, trustee and former president of the Guernsey County and Muskingum County Retired Teachers Association, a member of the Celtic Society, Columbia Scholastic Press Advisor Association, Board of Judges, John Glenn High School District Public Writer, 1964- 1972, Ohio School Journalism Association, Journalism Education Association, Ohio English Association, and Cambridge YMCA Century Club. Outstanding Senior Citizen Award in Guernsey County, from Area Agency on Aging, Community Builders Award, Lodge 632, Golden Keystone Award from Pennsylvania School Press, merit Award from Newspaper fund inc., Gold key Award from Columbia Scholastic Press Association, Community Service Award from the Cambridge Fire Dept., and Distinguished Service Award from Ohio university High School Publications. He was preceded in death by a nephew, Richard Luse.

He leaves his wife , Alma Lorraine Sherman Bryen of Cambridge, whom he

married Nov. 13, 1943; a great-niece, Rebekah Sherman of Norwich; three nieces, Nancy Luse of Abingdon, Va., Ginger Sherman of Zanesville and Carol Luse of Phoenix, Ariz.; a brother, R.D. Ruth Sherman of Cambridge; two nephews, Rick Sherman of Norwich and George Luse of Marshfield Hills, Mass.

Friends may call from noon to 2 P.M. time of service Sunday Dec. 28, 2003 at Bundy-Law Funeral Home. The Funeral Service will be at 2:00 P.M. with Rev. Wally Wilson officiating.

Burial will be in Northwood Cemetery. Military graveside services will be conducted by the Guernsey County Veterans Council.
