



## Gertrude Bates Smallshaw

Gertrude Bates Smallshaw, age 100, of Cambridge, died Tuesday, July 17, 2007 at the Red Carpet Health Care Center in Cambridge. She was born on December 14, 1906, in Newark, Ohio, daughter of the late William H. Bates and Bertha Wyscarver Bates.

Mrs. Smallshaw retired from Teaching for Cambridge School System in 1973, she also taught in Guernsey and Muskingum Counties, and substituted for the Guernsey County School System.
