April 17, 1917 - January 20, 2017

Grace Elizabeth Kintner of Columbus died January 20, 2017. She was born in 1917 in Shickley, Nebraska on the family farm homestead by her grandparents Swan and Ida Johnson. Her parents were John and Helen Johnson. She attended the University of Nebraska and Strickler's Business College in Topeka. In 1963 she and her husband Chan moved to Ohio and in 1965 they started Chan's Market in Cambridge, Ohio. After her husband's death in 1987, she continued to operate the store until it was sold in 1992. Grace moved to Pataskala in 1996 and to Columbus in 2014. She is survived by her four children: a daughter Claire and her husband Jim Wisman, and her three sons and their wives, Britt and Joyce Kintner, Bruce and Pam Kintner and Fred and Shelia Kintner, 8 grandchildren and 15 great grandchildren. She is also survived by a brother Joseph Johnson, a sister-in-law Delores Johnson, a brother-in-law Clyde Whitley and several nieces and nephews and their children. She is predeceased by her husband Chancy, grandson Jay Wisman, granddaughter Mackenzie Kintner, her sisters Ruth Johnson, Dora Curren and Josephine Billerbeck and a brother Gordon Johnson.
