Katharine M. Morisey age 95 of Cambridge, Ohio passed away December 29, 2013 at the Beckett House in New Concord, Ohio. She was born on April 26, 1918 in Jackson, Ohio, daughter of the late John Stanley and Katharine (Roberts) Morgan. She was a Class of 1940 graduate of The Ohio State University where she became affiliated with the Alpha Phi Sorority. She came to Cambridge in 1941, as the Cambridge district home service representative for the former Ohio Fuel Gas Co. (Columbia Gas). She was later employed as a Cambridge Schools secretary and a caseworker for the Guernsey County Children Services Board. Member of Unity Presbyterian Church where she served as a deacon and elder and was also a member of the Priscilla Circle. Member of AAUW (American Association of University Women), McClellan-Brown Sorosis, Wing 2 of Southeastern Medical Auxillary, former board member of Cambridge Concert Association and a Life member of the Ohio State University Alumni Association. Preceded in death April 26, 2003 by her husband James K. Morisey, whom she married December 19, 1942. She is survived by a daughter Patricia (Wallace) Rickards of Tucson, AZ., a son The Rev. James K.
