Kenneth David Froehlich age 77 of Cambridge, passed away August 25, 2011 with his loving family at his side. He was born on May 9, 1934 in Barnesville, Oh., to the late John and Hazel (Romick) Froehlich. He graduated from Barnesville High School and he attended college in Pittsburg, Pa. Ken held a variety of jobs throughout his lifetime. He worked as a shoe shine boy, drove cab for Greers Taxi, delivered newspapers for the Wheeling Intelligencer, was a construction foreman, and most recently retired from the State Auditor's office after 30 years of service. He was an avid Notre Dame football fan and actively attended all of his children and grandchildren's sports activities. He was a longtime member of St. Benedicts Catholic Church. He was preceded in death by his parents, 4 brothers, sister, his daughter Kimberly Froehlich, and his special friend and mother of his children, Carol

Froehlich. 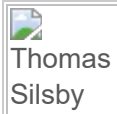
