



## Louise Druesedow

May 17, 1919 - November 8, 2009

Louise White McCullough Druesedow, age 90 of Flint, Michigan, formerly of Cambridge, Ohio, died Sunday, November 8, 2009 in Flint, Michigan. She was born on May 17, 1919 in Cambridge, a daughter of the late Roy E. White and Blanche Feaster White.

Mrs. Druesedow was a former member of the 9th Street United Methodist Church. She was a Graduate of Muskingum College in 1964, a member of the Retired Teachers Association and the Friends of the Library.

Louise was a former Elementary Teacher for 25 years in the Cambridge School System. She started her career at Glassplant Elementary and then taught for over 24 years at Oakland Elementary.
