Paul Carlton Clark, age 95 of Byesville, passed away on June 30, 2016. He was born on June 23, 1921 in Cambridge, a son of the late Carl Duncan Clark and Mary Trimble Clark. Mr. Clark was a graduate of Brown High School and a New York Business College. He served his country in World War II in the U.S. Navy and also served in the National Guard. He was a life member of the V.F.W. Post 2901, a member of the New Jerusalem Church, and the Shaffer Chapel A.M.E. Church where he served as a deacon. His family was a part of the first pioneer settlers of Ohio and Guernsey County.

He was a minister and retired businessman. Paul had served as Pastor for many area churches including Oakshade Chapel in Fairdale, the Evangelistic Center in Byesville, Boden Northfield Church, Cambridge Revival Center, and was a director of the Wayside Gospel Mission for over ten years. He was also owner operator of Clark Paint Company for over 20 years.

Paul is survived by: son Stephen D. (Elizabeth) Clark, a sister Mary Lou Ringer; daughters-in-law Alma Rapp and Dorothy Rapp; grandchildren; Stephen (Elisha) Clark II, Susan Rapp and Mark Rapp; great grandchildren Stephen III, Christopher, Alexis, Andrew and Annika and many other family members and several nieces and nephews.

Paul is preceded in death by, first wife Margaret Jean (Park) Rapp- Clark; second wife Irene (Hall) Batyk-Clark; two sons, Ernest Charles "Chuck" Rapp and Donald Paul Rapp; a grandson Christopher; and a brother George Clark. A graveside memorial service will be held at Northwood Cemetery on
