Paul L. "Johnny" Kenworthy, age 85 of Indian Camp passed away Monday, January 19, 2009 at Southeastern Ohio Regional Medical Center. Paul was born January 31, 1923 in Knox Twp. He owned and operated the family farm and did custom hauling for the Farmers Supply Company. He was also a Knox Township trustee for 23 years.

Mr. Kenworthy was an active member and a former trustee of Mt. Hermon Presbyterian Church and a 60 year member of The Indian Camp Grange. Paul was a W.W.II Navy Veteran serving on The USS Columbus. He enjoyed bowling, deer hunting, playing softball and loved playing card games. He encouraged his grandchildren and great grandchildren in everything they did as well as attending their activities. One of his favorite things was to have all of his family together for Sunday dinner at his house and taking his great grandchildren rides on his golf cart. His door was always open.
