Ronald L. "Ron" Branstetter, age 92 of Cambridge passed away on Monday, May 19, 2025 at his home. He was born on December 3, 1932 in Minneapolis, MN, a son of the late Jack E. Branstetter and Evelyn T. (Sandvold) Branstetter.

Mr. Branstetter was born in Minnesota. Shortly after birth, they moved to California where he lived for most of his life. He served his country in the U.S. Navy from 1951 to 1955.
