Spero N. Pandelos, age 75, passed away on Saturday, December 19, 2020, at Southeastern Ohio Regional Medical Center. He was born on September 28, 1945, at Martins Ferry, Ohio, son of the late Nick Pandelos and Dorothy (Poulos) Pandelos. Spero was a graduate of Cambridge High School and a member of the Greek Orthodox Church of the Life-Giving Fountain in Martins Ferry. He was a long-time employee of Randall Plastics in Cambridge, Ohio. Spero loved sports and was an avid fan of the Cambridge Bobcats and the Ohio State Buckeyes. He was also a member of the Fraternal Order of the Eagles 386 and the Loyal Order of the Moose Lodge 631 of Cambridge. Spero had a simple pleasure in life that we all learned from and that was being happy no matter where he was, who he was with, or what life handed him. His voice boomed the rafters with laughter and he enjoyed company more than anything. Everyone he came into contact with spoke of his big heart.

Spero is preceded in death by his grandparents Efthemios and Argiro Poulos, his parents, two brothers Efthemios "Tommy" N. Pandelos and Perry (Loretta) Pandelos of South Carolina, and a sister Kathryn Pandelos of Florida. He is survived by his brother Manuel (Denise) Pandelos of Florida and several nieces and nephews.

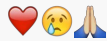

“ Whenever I think of Spero, I think of laughter and love. Spero was full of laughter and had a great love for his family. I remember vividly everyday when I would travel the state for my job, I could pick up the phone and call Spero, and I would instantly have the greatest company anyone could ask for. I took such comfort in our conversations. Whenever you called Spero, no matter what time it was, you were never bothering him. You could call him at 5:00 in the morning or midnight, and he would answer the phone and just start talking and reminiscing about the old times. We would barely get our greetings in, and he would immediately start on his wonderful stories. He had a story for everything, and I learned so much about our family from Spero. He would never run out of conversation, but if he did, he would talk about what faces he would see when he layed in bed and looked at the textures in the ceiling. He would often talk about seeing Yia Yia’s, Aunt Dorthy’s and Tommy’s faces in the ceiling, and he said it gave him great comfort. Any little thing made Spero happy, and when I called him, his laughter was infectious. No matter how I felt before I called, I always hung-up smiling, and laughing. Before Spero went to the Nursing Home, a lot of my state travels took me past Cambridge, and I would frequently drive down on Third street and would find Spero sitting in his chair, smoking his pipe talking about what pictures he could make out of the clouds, or all the family videos Harry would make for him, and he would play them back in his mind over and over again. I would drop off a pizza or sandwiches, and he would accept them as though we gave him a million dollars. He loved my kids like they were his own. For their birthdays and Christmas, he would give them things he made such as handmade pictures, he spent hours drawing, or other treasures he wanted to pass on to them, and would always try to give them his last bit of money. He was so generous and would give you his last dime, or the short off his back, he would tell all of us not to worry because he was going to win the lottery and make us all rich. He played the lottery a lot and anytime he won the lottery in small amounts, he would never think of himself, but would call and say he had money to give us or that he wanted to buy us something. He kept saying when he won it big, he

would split it evenly among all of us. To describe Spero as a caring man in an understatement. He was the caring, kind compassionate, loving human being in this world. He would often talk about my mom and dad, who he said, were like his own parents and paved the way for him, and how blessed he was to have them in his life, and of course he always spoke of Sophia and Greg who would call several times a day, visit him, and take pop, candy, and anything else he needed every single week. Spero would call several times a week if anyone in the family was sick, when of course he had worries of his own, but his concern was always about others and never himself. Spero you are now watching over us in heaven and I could not ask for a better angel than you. When I look up at the ceiling texture, I can only pray that I will see your smiling face looking down on me. Spero, we all love you more than anything, and even though I can't pick up the phone and call you on a whim, I will hear your laughter, see your face in the ceiling, and feel your love ring in our hearts forever.

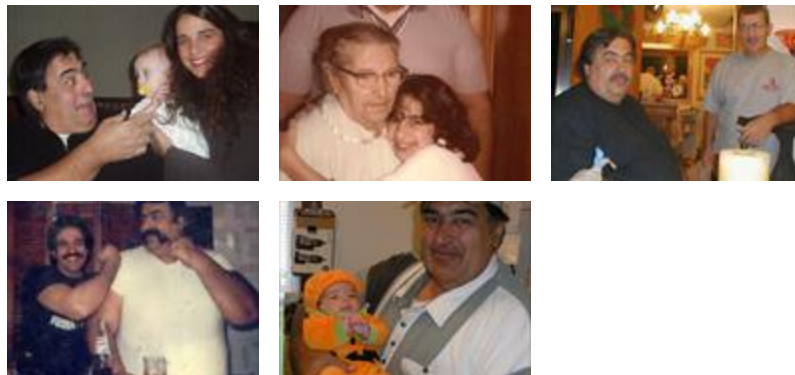
